Authors are encouraged to read our full instructions below – this table provides only the essentials.

BASIC INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS	
<b>GENERAL GUIDELINES</b>	Manuscripts should be COMPLETE, CONCISE, and CLEAR. Follow the basic <a href="#">Instructions for authors</a> and <a href="#">Detailed instructions for the preparation of papers</a>
<b>WORD LIMITS, etc.</b>	
Body text	<i>Original articles</i> should not exceed about 8,000 words <i>Review articles</i> should not exceed 12,000 words <i>Brief communications</i> should not exceed 4,000 words
Abstract	Maximum of 150 words in all types of articles Unstructured
Keywords	Maximum of six words, listed alphabetically, singular, separated with semicolons; lowercase except proper names; avoid abbreviations
Highlights (below the abstract)	Three bullet points, a maximum of 85 characters each including spaces, describe the study in lay terms
Tables/figures	The maximum number of tables/figures is 8 for an <i>original article</i> , 10 for a <i>review</i> , and 2 for <i>brief communication</i> . Their description (captions, values, units, etc.) should be consistent and informative, with all abbreviations explained.
Supplementary tables/figures	In the same/similar format as the usual tables/figures. Assign them as Fig. 1S, Table 1S, etc.
<b>TITLE PAGE INFORMATION</b>	
Title	Up to 140 characters, with a description of the study type, if relevant (e.g., a review, an article assigned to a special issue, etc.)
Short running title	Voluntary
Author names	Full name: given name(s) first, family name last
Affiliation information required	Department, institution, city, country, email (indicated with superscript *, **, ***; each on a new line)
Corresponding author contact details	Indicate with + sign
Persistent identifiers of the author(s), etc.	ORCID iD(s), identifiers of research organization(s), funder(s) and research project(s), if applicable
<b>STRUCTURE OF BODY TEXT, REFERENCES</b>	
Typical headings	<i>Original articles</i> : Introduction (background and objectives), Materials and methods, Results, Discussion (with a concluding paragraph), References <i>Brief communications</i> : text without subdivision, References Not numbered
Subheadings	Not numbered
Specific wording required for any section	Methods section must include a subsection “Statistical analysis”, identifying the variables and methods used.
References: maximum number	Not limited

<b>FORMATTING</b>	
Spelling	UK or US, if consistent
<b>SUBMISSION NOTES</b>	
Cover letter required?	Required only in the original version
Proposed reviewers: optional/mandatory? How many? What details are required?	OPTIONAL: suggest/oppose up to 3 potential reviewers (full name, email, institution)
Tables: separate files?	Include at the end of the manuscript only
Figures: separate files? Any formats preferred?	Submit high-resolution files in TIF or JPG format separately. <b>PDF file with the whole paper has to contain figures.</b> Figures can be also embedded in the manuscript, include them at the end of the Word file. For more information regarding the figures style, see <a href="#">Detailed instructions</a> .
Fee for open access?	Publication fee is EUR 890,-. All papers are published as open-access ones.
<b>JOURNAL POLICIES, etc.</b>	
Publication model	Open access. © The authors. Articles are distributed under the terms of the Creative Commons BY-NC-ND Licence.
Preprint and prepublication	Publication on any preprint server is acceptable but it has to be announced in the original submission. The author is responsible for the correct assignment of a paper state on the preprint server (e.g., the paper must not be under review in any other journal, book, etc.) and if accepted, it has to be clear from the heading of the article on the preprint server.
Peer review	Single blind (authors do not know the identity of reviewers)
